

## **Guidelines For Abstract Submission**

## TITLE OF THE PAPER (MAXIMUM 15 WORDS)

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## SUMMARY

The summary should be a single paragraph, without subtitles, indentation, or references. It should include the **problem**, **objectives**, **methods** used and the main **results** and **conclusions** of the study. Must be single-spaced in Times New Roman 11-point font. If it is necessary to cite references, provide the sources in parentheses. Use only units of the universal system. Use negative exponent instead of divisions for units (e.g., kg m-3 instead of kg/m3). Chemical formulas should be written in standard form, e.g., H<sub>2</sub>O. In decimal numbers put zero in front (e.g., 0.76 instead of .76). The first part of the summary should state the problem that **was** proposed to be solved and explain its justification. The summary should also describe the research methods, followed by the results obtained so far. Finally, the summary should conclude with the implications and contributions of the research to the area of knowledge. The content of the summary will be used to decide on the acceptance of the paper and, if accepted, whether it will be an oral presentation or poster. The abstracts will be reviewed by members of the Scientific Committee and the authors will be informed about the acceptance and the assigned presentation modality. The abstract should contain a maximum of 300 words. Only MS Word document format (.doc or .docx) is accepted. The keywords must be placed below the summary, leaving a single line space.

Keywords: maximum six, should not be included in the title of the paper, separated by commas (e.g., Keywords: cocoa, sustainable agriculture, adaptation, agroforestry systems, self-consumption).
